What are your tasks in the SIMPORT project (00:16 – 00:26 sec)?

We are responsible for software development in the project and work on all kinds of construction sites, everything that has to do with software architecture.

In SIMPORT, we try to find solutions for users on how they can better manage their location data and, above all, how they can be more confident with their location data.

The project is important because location data is very sensitive data and many users do not know about it and we would like to draw attention to this.

As the FH Münster, we are involved in the development of various building sites in the project, e.g. the learning app, with which we want to give users insight into their location data and show them what can be derived from their location data. Other building sites are, for example, a location privacy toolkit with which users can better manage their location data.
